

Participation of JAU in Krushi Mahotsava and its impact

Organizing Krushi Mahotsava was a unique gesture of Government of Gujarat, which provided an excellent opportunity of one -to -one interaction among scientists, officers of the line departments and farmers. They have come closer in solving the problems of farming community.

Junagadh Agricultural University played a vital role in the Mahotsava. Not only 600 Scientists/ Personnels visited the villages along with the Krushi Rath, University prepared a monumental publication encompassing the literature on agricultural, horticultural and medicinal crop technologies including those on water management, agricultural engineering and animal husbandary. This will undoubtedly serve as a guide to all involved in agriculture.

Such information was also imparted to farmersfriendly manner through Bhajans and Duhas. Sevaral V.C.D.s and Audio Cassettes were prepared by this university and made available to all the villages.

The scientists who accompanied the Rath, apprarised farmers about the latest technologies developed

by university. Khedut Shibirs were organized by Agricultural Produce Marketing Committees, wherein the scientists provided expert advice. Hon. Vice Chancellor, Director of Research and Director of Extension Education also actively participated in such Shibirs.

The farmers were given first hand knowledge of the latest technologies like fertilizer and water management, methods of seed preservation, use of drip and sprinkler irrigation, judicious and proper use of insecticides, pesticides, integrated disease, pest and weed management etc. They were convinced that by adopting university's recommendations only, many of their problems could be solved.

Through the contact of university scientists, farmers could get the detailed information on research, education and extension education activities of university. The impact is very obvious. All the seats for undergraduate B.Sc. course were full within a short period by students aspiring for admission in the College of Agriculture, Junagadh.

ESTABLISHMENT OF KISAN COUNCIL

Krishi Mahotsava has been a trend setter in the sense that it has provided ample opportunities for one-to- one interaction between agricultural scientists and farmers of the state. Junagadh Agricultural University has taken a step further in this direction and Vice Chancellor Dr. B. K. Kikani, has initiated to start Kisan Council to realize the dream of our Hon. Chief Minister Shri Narendra Modi for establishing live contact between Scientists and farmers at village level itself.

A Co-ordinator will be appointed in the village who will work with 11 to 55 progressive farmers and maintain contact between university, line departments and allied sectors. The council will look after its monetary affairs, university will only provide guidance and will impart information on new technologies through personal contact and through distribution of literature on agriculture, animal husbandry and fisheries.

The members of the council will discuss the problems faced by farmers on Akashwani, Doordarshan and in daily newspapers and will try to take care of the day to day problems of farmers.

New Project

A mega project on seed production is being launched. Seed is the vital input for increasing the productivity of any crop. Good quality high yielding varieties are the back bone of agriculture. To provide quality seeds of improved varieties and hybrids at large Agricultural University scale. Junagadh proposed an ambitious project to Indian Council of Agricultural Research, New Delhi with prime objective of providing quality seeds to the farmers at reasonable prices. The Indian Council of approval of the Agricultural Research has been received with the grant of Rs. 415 Lakhs. After the implementation of the project, farmers of Saurashtra will be the major beneficiaries as they can get seeds of latest varieties of different crops like groundnut, cotton, castor, wheat, cumin, garlic and vegetables at competitive prices. Besides seeds of crops, grafts and saplings of fruits, medicinal and ornamental plants will also be available to Orchaists and farmers at reasonable cost. Due to this project, several problems of the farmers will be taken care of and their economic condition will also improve through higher production and Gujarat will be in the fore front in the country in terms of productivity. Dr. B. K. Kikani, Vice Chancellor has persuaded hard for getting it sanctioned.

New Recommendations

The Variety Identification Committee has identified following varieties of groundnut developed at Main Oilseeds Research Station, Junagadh in its meeting held in October 2005.

(1) Gujarat Groundnut 8 (J 53)

Spanish bunch variety with higher pod yield than the check varieties JL 24 and TAG 24 (14.9 % and 6.9 % higher respectively), has been recommended for cultivation in Northern Maharashtra and Madhya Pradesh (Zone-III). Kernels are rose coloured and round shaped with higher yield than the check varieties tested.

(2) Gujarat Groundnut 16 (JSP 39)

This is a Virginia runner variety having elongated, medium sized and rose coloured kernels. The variety is suitable for cultivation in Tamil Nadu, Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, Kerala and Southern Maharashtra. The pod yield of this variety is 41.5 % and 27.4 % higher than the check varieties M 335 and ICGV 86325, respectively.


